



Why should I buy a Cirrus SF50 Vision Jet delivery position?

- **Much earlier delivery date.** If you order from Cirrus today, the next available SF50 Vision Jet delivers in the year 2023. Our positions deliver years earlier.
- **Bonus Depreciation** – New aircraft delivered in 2017 are eligible for 50% Bonus Depreciation in the year delivered. That drops to 40% in 2018 and 30% in 2019. This is subject to change. Consult your tax advisor.

How much does it cost?

- Factory positions, with next delivery in 2023, have a base price of \$1.96M **Plus** CPI adjustment starting July 2012. Options are also subject to CPI adjustment. Early positions had a \$1.39M base price **Plus** CPI adjustment starting in July 2009. An inflation adjusted 2017 base is \$1.57M.
- New deliveries, out the door in 2017, are priced around \$2,200M (\$1.390M Base Price + CPI Inflation Adjustment + Options + Service Programs).
- Estimated pricing for next available **2023** delivery direct from Cirrus Aircraft;
 - Base Price: \$1,960,000 (July 2012 dollars)
 - Typical installed options: \$ 400,000 (July 2012 dollars)
 - CPI Adjustment-Aircraft: \$ 250,000*
 - CPI Adjustment-Options: \$ 80,000*
 - Seller Premium \$ None
 - 3 Yr/600 Hour Concierge Prgm \$ 209,900** (2017 dollars)
(Engine Program, recurrent training, warranty)
 - Total \$2,899,900 – Delivered in 2023

*CPI Adjustments are estimates. The actual number in 2023 could be less or greater than these estimates. Of course, a fixed price is better.

**The maintenance programs are subject to inflation adjustment too.

When are payments due?

- The Seller's premium is due at the time the position is purchased along with any existing seller deposits held by Cirrus.
- A \$15,000 transfer fee must be paid, to Cirrus, at the time a position is sold to a new owner.

I want it! How do I buy it?

- AllJets works with the position Seller and Cirrus Aircraft to execute required transfer forms. The funds and transaction are securely handled with a purchase agreement through an escrow account.

What is CPI?

- The base price of the aircraft, and option pricing, are subject to an inflation escalator adjustment that is tied to the CPI-W, or Consumer Price Index-Workers Compensation, as published and provided by the US Bureau of Labor Statistics. For later delivery positions with a \$1.96M base price, the CPI-W is calculated from July 2012. The inflation adjustment is based on a calculation comparing the delivery year CPI to the July 2012 number.
